I wanted to write my own version of the story, to simply convey the different stages of the little girl's journey through the countryside, this little girl who leaves her mother's home to visit her grandmother and who meets a wolf. I wanted to make the charactersand the moments in the story as simple and as truthful as they could be. And very real.

The relationship with nature and with animality, even bestiality, seems essential to me. The dangerous, mysterious, unpredictable side of nature and animals, but also their beautiful and marvellous side, the part of them which is desirable and captivating; that's what I want to bring out.

The relationship with fear is primordial in this tale, and in the life of a child in general. In my opinion, addressing the question of fear with a child also means addressing the flip side of this emotion: desire.

#### JOËL POMMERAT

Joël Pommerat was born in 1963. He is a French playwright and director. He founded the Louis Brouillard theatre company in 1990. Joël Pommerat has the singularity of staging only his own plays and texts. In his opinion, there is no hierarchy: the direction and the text develop simultaneously during rehearsals. This is why he describes himself as « un ecrivain de spectacles »: « a writer of shows ».

In 1995 he created *Pôles*; in his view, the first of his plays to achieve artistic completion. It was also the first of his plays to be published, in 2002.

In 2004, the Strasbourg National Theatre invited the company to create and premiere the production Au Monde, the company's first big success; it received critical acclaim from audiences and critics alike. With the trilogy Au Monde (2004), D'une seule main (2005), Les Marchands(2006), Joël Pommerat anchored his plays more directly in contemporary reality, questioning our mental and social representations of the world around us. In his work, he addresses real life in its multiple aspects; material, concrete and imaginary.

In 2006, Au monde, Les Marchands and Le Petit Chaperon rouge returned to the Festival d'Avignon, where Joël Pommerat went on to create Je tremble (1 et 2) in 2008. He continued rewriting childrens' folk tales with Pinocchio in 2008 and Cendrillon (Cinderella) in 2011. In 2010, he created Cercles/Fictions using a circular set with a circular audience seating plan, a set design he continued to explore in Ma Chambre froide the following year. In 2013 he created La Réunification des deux Corées, using a bi-frontal stage where the audience members sit facing each other. In 2015 he created Ça ira (1) Fin de Louis, a true fiction based on the French Revolution in 1789.

In 2011 Joël Pommerat collaborated with the composer Oscar Bianchi, adapting his play Grâce à mes yeux (Thanks to My Eyes) for the Aix en Provence Opera Festival. In 2014 he presented the opera Au Monde at the Théâtre de la Monnaie à Bruxelles, with Philippe Boesmans as composer. The two worked together again in 2017, adapting *Pinocchio* for the Aix en Provence Opera Festival 2017.

Joël Pommerat has received numerous awards for his work. Since he first started out, he has been supported by both the Théâtre de Brétigny-sur-Orge and Théâtre Paris-Villette in Paris. In 2007 he was invited by Peter Brook to became artist-in-residence at the Bouffes du Nord Theatre until 2010. He then became associate artist at the National Theatre of Brussels as well as at the Paris Odeon, Theatre of Europe. He has been a member of the association of artists at Nanterre-Amandiers since 2014. La Compagnie Louis Brouillard is also supported by « La Coursive »: Scène Nationale of La Rochelle (France) and by « La Comédie » in Geneva (Switzerland).

Joël Pommerat strives to create a form of visual theatre, both intimate and spectacular. His work centers on the actors' presence on stage and the audience's confusion.

He has written two books about his artistic approach : Théâtres en présence (2007) and, with Joëlle Gayot, Joël Pommerat, troubles (2010).

All his texts are published by Actes Sud.

The show will be performed in French and surtitled in the language of the host country.

**Length**: 40 minutes (without interval)

For all ages. From 8 years upwards when the show is surtitled.

**Audience capacity**: 350 spectators general public / 300 spectators schools and colleges.
